Canseco serves as Master of Ceremonies at Texas Federation of Republican Women State Convention

Republican Candidate for Congress wows GOP Women in El Paso

San Antonio, Texas — Quico Canseco, the only announced Republican Candidate for the US Congress in the 23rd District of Texas joined Republican women from across Texas this weekend as the Texas Federation of Republican Women (TFRW) held their 26th biennial convention, at the Judson F. Williams Convention Center in El Paso. The TFRW is the largest women's organization in the state of Texas with 12,000 members in 163 chapters.

Canseco, the only man currently serving on the board of the TFRW, served his fellow TFRW members as the Master of Ceremonies for the convention. In his official capacity, Canseco made sure the convention went smoothly and introduced a host of GOP leaders to the convention delegates including Texas' two United State Senators, Kay Bailey Hutchison and John Cornyn.

Canseco, who serves as the TFRW's Associate Member Liaison said that he was honored that TFRW President Borah Van Dormolen asked him to participate in such an important way. "It was a great pleasure to get to introduce to the convention the esteemed guests from our state's Republican leadership and keep the program moving along. The members of the TFRW are dear to me and to be able to serve on the board and help with the convention has been a privilege," said Canseco.

Joining Cornyn and Hutchison were Gov. Rick Perry, Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst and virtually every statewide elected Republican. Congressman Mike Conaway was also in attendance. Both President and Mrs. Bush recorded a video for the 500 or so attendees.

"It was an inspirational event to be sure," said Canseco. "I left extremely uplifted about not only my own race for Congress here in the 23rd District, but also the prospects of Republican victories across our state and nation. One could not have been in attendance

at this convention and not have felt overwhelming excitement about our prospects in 2008,” Canseco added.

“I have returned to San Antonio with new vigor and I look forward to sharing that excitement with the hardworking Texans who live, work and raise families in the 23rd Congressional District. I resume my campaign confident that I will have the strong support and prayers of TFRW members from South Texas and all across our great state,” Canseco concluded.
